



Dear Prospective Intermountain Healthcare Residency Candidate,

Thank you for your interest in the Intermountain Healthcare Residency programs. Enclosed you will find information about the residency programs and application forms. All application materials must be received by **January 5**.

The Intermountain Pharmacy Practice Residency programs participate in the Resident Matching Program of the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP) and applicants will be required to participate in the matching program as well. Each institution has been assigned a Program Code: Intermountain Medical Center, **112713**; McKay-Dee Hospital, **112726**, Primary Children's Medical Center, **112727**; Utah Valley Medical Center, **112728**, Pharmacy Administration two year PGY1&2, **129018**. In addition, our managed care organization, Select Health has a PGY1 managed care residency program, **139714**. All applicants must submit the following information:

1. Intermountain Healthcare Pharmacy Practice Residency Application Form
2. Intermountain Healthcare Employee Application - this process must be completed on-line at [www.intermountainhealthcare.jobs](http://www.intermountainhealthcare.jobs) - Job Title - Pharmacist, Resident, Job #65815
3. Current Curriculum Vitae
4. Three recommendations on the ASHP Residency Applicant Recommendation Request Form
5. College of Pharmacy transcripts
6. Short Essay describing career goals and why you want to complete a residency

Because of number of facilities available, residents are interviewed in the following blocks: 1) Adult Hospitals PGY1 (McKay, Utah Valley and Intermountain Medical Center), 2) Pediatric Hospital PGY1 (Primary Children's) and 3) Pharmacy Administration PGY1&2. Residents are asked to indicate their interest on application, but may request an interview in all 3 groups if interested. Based on the number of applications, unfortunately, not all potential candidates may be granted an interview.

Residents must be eligible for licensure in the State of Utah. Information on obtaining your Utah pharmacist license is available at the website of the State of Utah Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing at <http://www.dopl.utah.gov/licensing/pharmacy.html>.
