DONATIONS TO THE FOUNDATION HELP BRING NEW AND ENHANCE EXISTING HEALTHCARE SERVICES FOR COMMUNITY RESIDENTS

The sole purpose of the Logan Regional Hospital Foundation is to raise money to help bring quality healthcare services and technology provided by Logan Regional Hospital to the valley.

The Foundation accepts donations from community members then uses the funds to purchase state-of-the-art healthcare equipment, offer continuing education, and enhance preventative and diagnostic healthcare services. The Foundation's motto: Bringing Healing Home. These words describe how generous donations make possible the provision of healthcare services right here in our community, without the need for extensive travel outside the valley, making a remarkable difference for Cache Valley families.

One example is the Logan Regional Cancer Center that the community helped to build through donations to the Foundation. Cancer patients who previously had to travel to Ogden or farther to receive radiation therapy can now get therapy right here at the center.



Logan Regional's Cancer Center has allowed hundreds of Cache Valley cancer patients to receive state-of-the-art radiation therapy close to home.

Another example of how your donations benefit our community is the healthcare services provided at the Cache Valley Community Health Clinic. Every year, donations

to the Foundation help thousands of uninsured community residents get basic healthcare services for free at this clinic. Volunteer physicians and practitioners care for minor illnesses. Additionally, they

offer basic specialty care each month, such as dental services, dermatology services, and women's health services. In 2009, the clinic served 2,449 patients.

Logan Regional's Pediatric Rehabilitation center is yet another way you help to bring specialized services and

equipment to our community. Pediatric Rehabilitation therapists provide physical therapy, occupational therapy, and speech and hearing services to hundreds of Cache

Valley children with special needs. The center uses donations to continue to meet the kids' needs for specialized equipment that helps them to live stronger, more independent lives.

INTERVENTIONAL HEART SERVICES ARE ON THE HORIZON AT LOGAN REGIONAL HOSPITAL

Logan Regional Hospital works closely with cardiologists and other physician specialists to provide patients with a range of heart testing, catheterization, and cardiac rehabilitation services. The hospital currently offers heart testing services and diagnostic heart catheterization services, as well as emergency treatment, stabilization, and transport of heart patients in the Emergency Room.

Logan Regional is considering expanding the heart services available to Cache Valley residents.

Patients requiring interventional cardiac treatment would no longer need to travel outside the valley for this service. Plans are underway to build two state-of-the-art fully digital catheterization labs at Logan Regional, and the hospital is currently working with the Intermountain Medical Group to recruit an interventional cardiologist to work with Logan's existing skilled cardiologists.



Logan Regional Hospital currently offers heart testing services and diagnostic heart catheterization services in the catheterization lab.

Logan Regional Hospital has been providing cardiac services to Cache Valley residents since the hospital's opening in 1980, but with a new experienced cardiologist and the purchase of some state-of-the-art equipment, the hospital could extend this treatment to include treatment heart catheterization and coronary artery interventions such as balloon angioplasty, treatment of heart rhythm disorders, and placement of pacemakers and internal defibrillators.

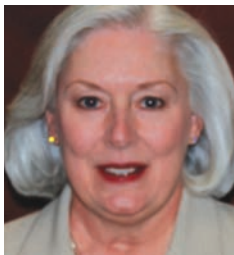


Rod Hunter, Chair. I participate in fund raising because I feel strongly about giving others access to information, opportunities, and facilities they may not otherwise be able to access or afford.

Alan Robinson. I enjoy helping to provide important services that otherwise might not be available to members of this community.

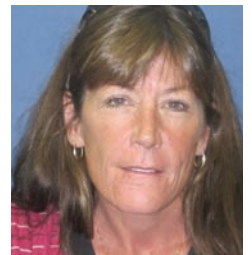
As chief financial officer for Logan Regional Hospital, Alan participates on the Foundation's board and serves as secretary/treasurer.
