Fundraising Campaign Reaches Successful Conclusion

Since 2020, workplace violence has been at an all-time high in the healthcare industry. To help prevent this, St. Mary's launched a creative and innovative solution last year through a team of trained K9 dogs and their loving, expert handlers called the K9 Security Program.

The purpose was twofold – the dogs de-escalate potential concerning situations and provide emotional support to caregivers and patients.

To support these efforts the St. Mary's Foundation committed to raise funds throughout 2023. The community came out in full force and the campaign exceeded its goal and successfully concluded the fundraising campaign for the newly implemented K9 Security Program.

The community came out in full force and the campaign exceeded its goal.

Donations totaled \$627,500, surpassing the goal of \$545,000. Additional matching dollars contributed through the Foundation Board's Matching Gift Program provided a total impact of \$827,500 to



the program. Due to the overwhelming community support, St. Mary's has already added an additional K9 team and is working toward another this year.

Prinsters create first general oncology endowment at St. Mary's

When philanthropists Tony and Sally Prinster set their sights on strengthening the oncology department at St. Mary's Medical Center, they did something remarkable.

In the summer of 2023, they established the Anthony F & Sally Prinster Oncology Endowed Fund with a bequest that included a \$200,000 match from the St. Mary's Foundation. This is the first general oncology endowment at St. Mary's and will be used to ensure continuous resources for cancer care.

Tony and Sally are lifelong residents of Western Colorado. Tony was born in Grand Junction in 1941 at the original St. Mary's Hospital, and Sally grew up on her family's hunting and fishing lodge on the White River near Meeker, Colorado. They were married in 1965.

The way cancer has touched our lives made it important for us to support the oncology work at St. Mary's.

The Prinsters have spent their lives in the service of others. Throughout the decades Tony and Sally have supported the mission of St. Mary's and they believe that supporting St. Mary's, whether by financial means or with a gift of time and effort, can enhance all lives in Western Colorado.

Throughout his career, Tony has been active in professional and community organizations including serving on the Board of St. Mary's Hospital and the Board of the Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth Health Services Corporation.

Sally has also been active in the community. She joined St. Mary's Auxiliary working on fundraising projects in the years prior to the creation of what is now the St. Mary's Hospital Foundation. She organized and chaired the yearly Christmas Tree Gala Auctions and supported other endeavors at the hospital.

At 49 years old, Sally was diagnosed with breast cancer. She underwent a double mastectomy and beat cancer, but 15 years later it came back and had metastasized into her lymph nodes. She got chemotherapy, radiation, infusions and surgery at St. Mary's. She is now living cancer-free.

"I had the most amazing care at St. Mary's," said Sally. "The oncologists, doctors and nurses were incredible, and I'm beyond grateful for them. That was one of the major drivers of the endowment. The way cancer has touched our lives and the lives of our friends and families made it important for us to support the oncology work at St. Mary's."

The Prinsters were recently honored with the Sister Michel Award for Philanthropists of Year for their unwavering commitment to St. Mary's healing mission. Sister Michel spent much of her life in the healthcare ministry and served many years as president and CEO at St. Mary's, and she formally established the St. Mary's Foundation.

"Throughout the years, we worked with and watched the Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth work with humility, dedication and perseverance," said Sally. "We were very humbled and honored to receive the award. We're so grateful that we're able to give back to a place that's given so much to our community."

"Sally and I are proud to be lifelong supporters of St. Mary's and its mission to provide quality healthcare for the region, Tony said. "We've been beneficiaries of the services St. Mary's has provided over many years and this is our way of giving back to help future generations."

Mission Highlights

Caring for the Caregiver Fund

The Foundation established the Caring for the Caregiver Fund in 2022 to support our caregivers through education, social support, self-care activities, and meaningful recognition. Throughout 2023, over **\$126,000** was utilized to enhance and sustain the health and wellbeing of our clinical workforce.

- **\$27,000 in education** funds to support caregiver conference and training opportunities.
- Supported the annual **Caregiver Week** activities by providing yoga, chair massages, ice cream, and hot chocolate and cinnamon rolls.
- Provided funds to initialize caregiver mental health programs which included the establishment of **CareFlight's Critical Incident Stress Management Team** and initializing stress and resilience training for caregivers by the HeartMath Institute.

- Placing **14 massage chairs** throughout St. Mary's campus to provide relaxation opportunities for our caregivers.
- Support of caregiver recognition and celebrations including the expansion of the **Daisy and Monarch Awards**.

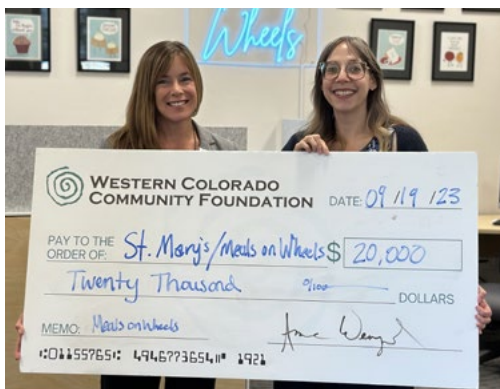

Pink the Rink

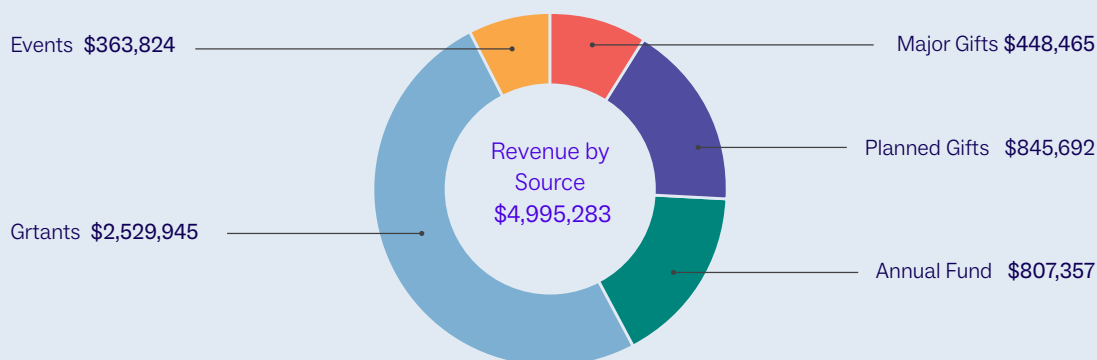

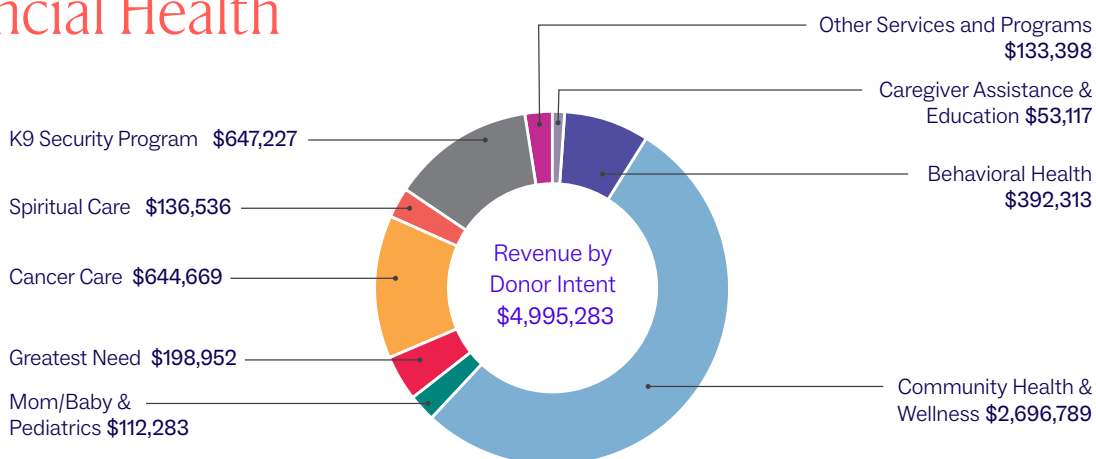
Coffee for a Cure

Stocks and Appreciated Securities

One way to boost your charitable contributions is to give shares of appreciated stock instead of cash. They are easily valued without an appraisal and easy to transfer. Donating appreciated securities before they are sold typically results in a tax advantage. A tax deduction is normally allowed based on the market value at the time of the gift. Since the deduction is based on current value, rather than cost, no tax is paid on the appreciation.

Tribute Gifts

Tribute gifts are given in honor or memory of a special person – perhaps a caregiver, family member, or friend. They are given in thoughtful remembrance of a life; in recognition of a special occasion; or in appreciation of service. These tributes serve as a permanent expression of love, honor, and recognition.

Endowments

Endowments are invested for growth and income in a diversified portfolio and are strategically managed by our Finance Committee. Each endowment distribution is used according to the donor's intent as outlined in a formal agreement between the donor and the Foundation. Funds earned from an endowment may support a program and are distributed to the hospital annually in accordance with the policies established by the Foundation.

Real Estate

The Foundation accepts gifts of real estate, including houses, condominiums, commercial properties, farm land, rental property, and undeveloped land after a thorough review of the property and its potential usage by the Foundation.
