

**PROJECT OBJECTIVE:** Strengthen Primary Children's Hospital in Salt Lake City

# What if...you could ensure that unborn babies with birth defects receive lifesaving surgery in utero?

### **THE SITUATION**

Through fetal surgery, surgeons are now able to remove tumors or other dangerous growths and repair structural defects in a baby's heart, lungs, or nervous system — defects that formerly led to impaired heart function, spina bifida, and even death. Until now, parents in Primary Children's Hospital's six-state, 400,000-square-mile service area have had to look outside of the Intermountain West for this kind of intervention. The new Utah Fetal Center will offer lifesaving treatments to expectant mothers and their unborn babies, right in their backyard. Consider that:

- Utah is booming, with one of the fastest-growing populations in the United States over the last decade.
- The region projects a staggering 50% increase in the pediatric service population by 2040, making fetal surgery services ever more imperative.

- The ability to detect and repair birth defects in utero was previously available in the Intermountain West only in Denver and California.
- In the U.S., 120,000 families each year receive the terrifying news that their unborn child has a birth defect.

#### THE CRITICAL NEED

Every 4½ minutes, a baby is born with a birth defect in the United States. For severe birth defects, the health and lifespan of the child can be severely impacted.

In years past, there would have been no solution for these families except to wait until the baby was born, which often resulted in less-than-ideal outcomes for the child. Today, advances in fetal surgery allow skilled surgeons to perform corrective surgery in utero, significantly reducing the risk of debilitating pain and physical limitations for the child.

## **THE PROMISE: Bringing Fetal Surgery to Utah**

Through a collaboration between Primary Children's Hospital and the University of Utah, the new Utah Fetal Center will provide lifesaving fetal

surgery. Equipped with advanced fetal imaging and antenatal monitoring equipment, the Center will provide a calm, supportive

environment for expectant mothers and families.

Private "nesting rooms" will accommodate families during long appointment

days. Dedicated
conference spaces will
provide comfortable,
confidential places where
families and clinicians can
confer on care plans.

In addition to allowing Primary Children's Hospital to recruit leading national researchers to

advance innovative fetal research, the new Utah Fetal Center will:

- Establish a best-in-class fetal intervention team and facility.
- Offer family support groups, childbirth classes, and psychological services.
- Extend the Center's reach to distant communities through telemedicine.
- Help develop a fetal database needed to pinpoint best practices.
- Facilitate training for the next generation of caregivers.
- Provide funding for travel, room and board, and daily needs for families with limited means.
- · Offer vital education materials .
