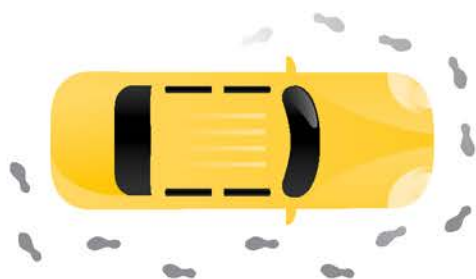




BE SMART BEFORE BACKING UP

Every seven days a child in Utah is run over by a car in a driveway or parking lot. This can be prevented.



- Check the street or surrounding area for children before driving. It is best to walk completely around your car. Drivers of large vehicles should take extra care to do this.
- You should adjust the driver's seat to see out of the rear window, roll down windows to hear children,

and also adjust side- and rear-view mirrors to reduce blind spots. If possible, use backup cameras and sensors to ensure the area behind your car is clear.

- Children should be actively supervised when a driver is leaving the home and taught not to play around or under cars.
- Attach the "Spot the Tot" removable window cling to the inside of the driver's side window where you can see it before getting into your car.
