




SALT LAKE CITY

Residency Description

- The Intermountain Healthcare PGY1 Community Pharmacy residency program trains pharmacists in a variety of community-based care settings. Residents have the opportunity to blend required rotations and several elective experiences to meet their professional goals.
- Teaching certification program is available with opportunities for lecturing and precepting at local pharmacy schools. Residents will attend the bimonthly core curriculum with other Intermountain Healthcare residents.
- Rotation opportunities in block and longitudinal format are provided in a variety of settings throughout the Intermountain Healthcare System:

Salary and Benefits

Residents are paid a competitive salary and are eligible for a complete benefits package including:

Residency Qualifications & Application

- Graduate from an ACPE-accredited pharmacy program with a Doctor of Pharmacy degree.
- Candidates must be eligible for Utah licensure as a pharmacist in Utah within the first 60 days of the program.
- Submit the following through PhORCAS by January 5th:
 - Residency and Intermountain employee applications at: www.intermountainhealthcare.jobs
 - Curriculum vitae
 - 3 letters of recommendation
 - College of pharmacy transcript or class rank
 - Letter of intent highlighting your reasons for pursuing a community pharmacy residency
