


BENEFITS AND QUALIFICATIONS

- Graduate from an ACPE-accredited pharmacy program with a Doctor of Pharmacy degree.
- Successful completion of an ASHP Accredited PGY1 Pharmacy Residency.
- Candidates must be eligible for Utah licensure.
- Submit the following through PhORCAS by January 5th:
 - Residency application (and Intermountain Employee application) at: www.intermountainhealthcare.jobs
 - Curriculum vitae
 - 3 letters of recommendation, including 1 from your PGY1 Residency Program Director or preceptor
 - College of pharmacy transcript or class rank
 - Letter of intent highlighting your reasons for pursuing an ambulatory care residency
