Timing	Major Steps	Key Points	Reasons Why
Room Idle Time	Cleaning after Aerosol Treatment Let room sit for 1 hour from completion of Aerosol treatment. Time of completion is on the sign	1. If you need to enter the room before the 1 hour after treatment, a PAPR or N95 mask is required	
	For Droplet/contact Isolation: No room idle time is required	1. You can begin cleaning as soon as the patient leaves the room	
Caregiver Prep	Don appropriate PPE	1. Gloves, Gown, face shield, procedural mask No respiratory PPE is required once the room has sat for required time after aerosol	
Cleaning procedure	Remove general waste (trash, linen, red bagged waste)	1. Remove linen 2. Remove the regular waste, PPE goes into regular trash 3. Remove any medical waste (red bag waste) and place it in the appropriate location for storage and pick up	See guidance for waste Disposal_ Novel Coronavirus for specific waste handling procedures
	Clean and disinfect all horizontal surfaces , including countertops , sink and high touch areas .	1. Begin at the entrance of the door and work around the room cleaning handles, thermostats and light switches 2. Remove exam table paper 3. Wipe down furnishings, exam tables, stools, mayo stands, chair frames, counters, front of cabinets, writing surfaces, shelves, telephones, computer keyboard and tables 4. Sink and facet	Disinfectant must meet the required dwell time on the surface to be effective. Purple top = 2 min Gray top = 3 min Orange top = 3 min

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Clean and disinfect any equipment that stays in the room. 2. Clean any equipment that leaves the room 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Clean any equipment that stays in the room. (blood pressure cuff, etc.) 2. If any equipment needs to leave the room and be stored somewhere else, clean the equipment with required disinfectant for specific piece of equipment 	
	Clean and disinfect the bathroom (if applicable)	 <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Always clean from cleanest to dirtiest part of the bathroom. 	
	 Doff PPE and perform hand hygiene	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. PPE is placed in the regular trash 2. Always perform proper hand hygiene after completing the cleaning of the room
