Accelerated Care

Goal to provide ER visits of 1 hour or less for low acuity patients



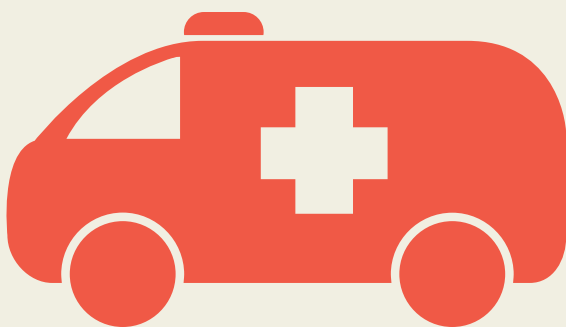
Observation Unit

Allows extended monitoring of patients for up to 23 hours



TeleHealth

24 Hour access to specialized consults – one of the most telehealth capable facilities in the nation



Level III Trauma Center:

Layton Hospital is seeking designation as a level III trauma center by the State of Utah Bureau of emergency medical services in 2019.



Stroke - Patients presenting with stroke symptoms are evaluated in real time, and treated locally with early interventions by Intermountain neurologists located off site.



Critical Care - For complex or severe patients our caregivers can connect with critical care intensivists to get additional clinical support.



Newborn Critical Care - Our smallest patients have access to neonatal specialists, which serve as a critical safety net in the first moments of life.
