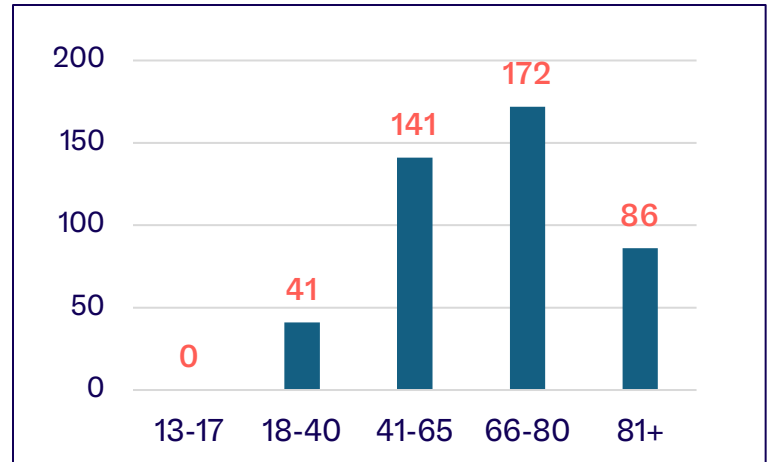

OUR TEAM

- Physicians, board certified in Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation, and Advanced Practice Providers are highly trained to work in collaboration to provide advanced medical care
- Nursing staff specially trained in rehabilitation
- Occupational therapists provide treatment to improve, regain and maintain the skills needed for self-care, activities of daily living such as dressing, eating, bathing and problem solving
- Physical therapists provide treatment to improve mobility, balance, coordination and strength
- Speech-language pathologists provide treatment to improve communication, swallowing and cognitive deficits
- Social Workers and Care Managers coordinate care in the hospital, arrange care after discharge and provide counseling as needed
- Dietitians ensure proper nutrition for healing
- Comprehensive medical specialists provide resources for consultation, follow-up and ongoing care

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Require daily physician care & 24-hour rehab nursing
- Need at least two forms of therapy (physical, occupational and/or speech)
- Be able to participate in three hours of therapy per day, five days per week
- Have potential to improve physical & functional skills

WHAT TO BRING

- Shorts or loose-fitting pants, T-shirts or blouses, sleepwear, walking shoes, a light jacket or sweater
- Any personal items that will make your stay more comfortable, such as hygiene products, photos or a blanket
- If you wear glasses, dentures, hearing aids or use a CPAP at home, please bring these with you
- **Please leave jewelry and other valuables at home**
