

## **Oncology Team Expectations**

Caps: New admissions per day: 5 per Intern, 10 per Resident  
Transfers per day: 2 per Intern, 4 per Resident  
New admissions per 2 days: 8 per Intern, 16 per Resident  
Total patients (touches): 8 per Intern, 12 per Resident

Work hours: Interns and residents must have 8 hours between shifts.

Schedule: 6:30am – 7:00am Check-out  
8:00am - 9:00am Hospitalist Rounds  
9:00am – 9:30am Teaching Rounds  
9:30am – 11:00am Multidisciplinary Management Rounds  
12:00noon – 1:00pm Noon Conference  
3:00pm - 4:00 pm Case Conference if you are scheduled to attend  
4:00pm – 4:30pm Check-out

Answer your pager until 6:00pm.  
ICU transfers until 3:00pm.  
Admissions until 4:00pm.

Oncology patients: The team only accepts patients that are managed primarily by an Oncologist. If a patient is admitted to the team with no *active* oncology issues, the team may review the case with the Chief Resident, Dr. Morton, or Dr. Doan and sign off.

ICU patients: Patients in the ICU will be managed by ICU teams with the Pulmonologist assuming care. Oncology team should continue to follow daily (peripherally) in ICU. When patient transferred out of ICU, Oncology team will usually resume primary management, but communication between teams should determine best care for the pt.

Hospitalist Rounds: Management of medical issues will be discussed on all patients and new patients will be seen at the bedside.

Teaching Rounds: Oncologist will meet with team to discuss topics in Oncology.

Multidisciplinary Rounds: Presentation to Oncologist should briefly summarize cancer diagnosis to include age, gender, primary oncology issue, stage on treatment (neoadjuvant/first line/second line/salvage), chemotherapy/radiation therapy, then the current hospital issues. Rounds will also include Palliative care involvement if indicated.

Conference: Be on time. You are expected to attend both noon conference and case report when scheduled. Team presents a case at case report with a teaching point. Keep teaching points to 2-3 minutes, and present new information or studies.
