Dr. McCarthy's clinical interests include general child and adolescent psychiatry, eating disorders including family based treatment, anxiety disorders and depressive disorders. Dr. McCarthy is currently the chair for the Utah Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and is interested in mental health outreach and integration.
