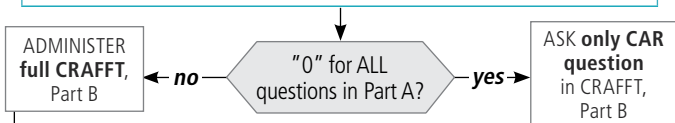
BASIC SCREENING

(ages 12 to 18 at preventive care visits)

SCREEN with the CRAFFT, Part A, by asking:

During the past 12 months, on how many days did you?

1. Drink more than a few sips of beer, wine, or any drink containing alcohol?
Say "0" if none.
2. Use any marijuana (pot, weed, hash, or in foods) or "synthetic marijuana" (like "K2" or "Spice")? Say "0" if none.
3. Use anything else to get high (like other illegal drugs, prescriptions or over-the-counter medications, and things that you sniff or "huff"? Say "0" if none.



SCREEN with CRAFFT, Part B, by asking:

| C | Have you ever ridden in a CAR driven by someone (including yourself) who was "high" or had been using alcohol or drugs? |
| R | Do you ever use alcohol or drugs to RELAX , feel better about yourself, or fit in? |
| A | Do you ever use alcohol or drugs while you are by yourself, or ALONE ? |
| F | Do you ever FORGET things you did while using alcohol or drugs? |
| F | Do your FAMILY or FRIENDS ever tell you that you should cut down on your drinking or drug use? |
| T | Have you ever gotten into TROUBLE while you were using alcohol or drugs? |

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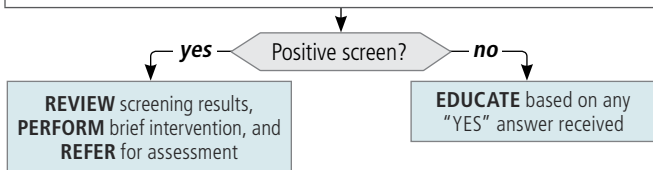
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BASIC SCREENING, CONT.

SCORE *CRAFFT* to determine if positive screen

SCORING INSTRUCTIONS:

- *CRAFFT* scoring: Each "yes" response in Part B scores 1 point.
- A total score of 2 or higher is a positive screen, indicating a need for additional assessment.



HIGH-RISK SCREENING

Patient presents who meets high-risk criteria*

* Intoxicated or impaired; obvious risk; or requesting treatment
