

# PHARMACY RESIDENCY PROGRAM

## THE POST GRADUATE YEAR ONE (PGY1) PHARMACY RESIDENCY PROGRAM is an

organized, directed, postgraduate training program in pharmacy practice. Rotations are available in a broad variety of settings with over 90 learning experiences available throughout the system. Residents complete their 5 required rotations at their home base facility, with the exception of drug information, which is completed at the corporate office. At least one elective is completed at the resident's home base facility and the other 4 electives can be done throughout the system.

Intermountain Healthcare also offers additional residency programs – PGY1 residencies in Community and Managed Care, a 2-year Drug Information residency, and PGY2 programs in Ambulatory Care, Cardiology, Critical Care, Emergency Medicine, and Pediatrics. PGY1 residents are eligible to apply to early commit with our PGY2 programs.

The program requires rotations in ambulatory care, critical care, drug information, internal medicine and practice management with elective opportunities in a variety of practice settings. Rotations are offered in the following areas:

#### PRIMARY CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL



The largest geographical service area of any children's hospital in the U.S. The 289-bed facility is a level I Trauma Center and is equipped to care for

neonates, children, and adolescents with complex illnesses and injuries. Primary Children's Hospital is associated with the University of Utah School of Medicine Department of Pediatrics, enabling patients and staff to benefit from its research and clinical expertise.

#### **UTAH VALLEY HOSPITAL**



Utah Valley is a 400-bed referral hospital, level II Trauma Center, and certified stroke center with a level III NICU. It offers unique learning opportunities which include: NICU, Pediatrics,

critical care units, glucose management, rural pharmacy management, behavioral medicine, and ambulatory care opportunities in family medicine, IV therapy, and the diabetes clinics.

## **CANDIDATE INFORMATION**

Candidates must graduate from an ACPE-accredited pharmacy program with a doctor of pharmacy degree with a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Candidates must be eligible for Utah licensure and are expected to obtain licensure as a pharmacist in Utah within the first 90 days of the program.

#### **CANDIDATE APPLICATION & SELECTION**

Applicants must register with PhORCAS and submit the following information

- Residency and Intermountain Employee application at www.intermountainhealthcare. org/careers
- Curriculum vitae
- Three letters of recommendation
- College of pharmacy transcript
- Letter of intent highlighting your reasons for pursuing a residency
- Supplemental documents: written answer to two questions and PCOA score (for data collection purposes only)

Selected applicants will be requested to visit the Salt Lake City area for on site interviews during January or February.
